# ACCOMMODATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF KENT

## The University has a range of accommodation for undergraduate and postgraduate students at its Canterbury and Medway campuses.

As an undergraduate at Canterbury, you can choose to live in one of our colleges or courts, each with its own distinctive character.

Or you can opt for our student village, Park Wood, which is just a few minutes' walk from central campus.

We also have dedicated accommodation for postgraduates at Woolf College, where students stay in en-suite or studio rooms.

Our Medway accommodation, Liberty Quays, is part of a waterside development. Offered in partnership with Liberty Living, the flats have en-suite rooms with shared kitchens.

Whatever your budget and preferences, we have an option to suit you – but you do need to meet our criteria and deadlines to secure your place.



### Next steps: applying for accommodation

#### 1) Check your eligibility

We offer accommodation to eligible full-time students for their first year of study. See p13 for eligibility criteria.

#### 2) Specific needs

If you have particular needs, for example, you use a wheelchair, then please contact us for advice on which accommodation is likely to be most suitable for you.

#### 3) Work out your budget

#### 4) Consider your options

Our quick reference guide on p14-15 shows the cost range for the current academic year for each accommodation option and the number of weeks you pay for. This is intended as a guide.

Please note that prices for the 2018-19 academic year will be available from January 2018.

You should apply online for your accommodation as soon as you accept your University place. See p12 for details of how soon you should apply and what our deadlines are.

# ACCOMMODATION AT CANTERBURY

**Set within 300 acres of parkland, the Canterbury campus offers a choice of accommodation and extensive catering and social facilities, just a short walk from the city.**

The campus has:

- over 5,400 bedrooms
- 84% of bedrooms with self-catering facilities
- high-speed wired and Wi-Fi internet connection throughout the accommodation

All utility costs and personal contents room insurance are included in the accommodation fees.

## Accommodation types

Kent is one of only a few universities in the UK to offer accommodation in a college environment.

The colleges at Kent have their own distinctive character and offer a welcoming and diverse community.

Other options for undergraduates on campus are rooms in Becket Court and flats at Tyler Court, as well as houses and flats in our student village Park Wood. You will be affiliated to one of the University's colleges.

For postgraduates, we offer accommodation at Woolf College, Tyler Court A and Darwin Houses.

This table shows the occupancy periods for college accommodation from September to June. Occupancy periods vary between 31 and 39 weeks, depending on whether you can stay in your accommodation during the winter and spring vacations.

<b>Darwin College, Keynes Flats/Houses, Park Wood, Tyler Court B&amp;C (Flats), Turing College</b>	39 weeks, including winter and spring vacations
<b>Eliot and Rutherford Colleges</b>	37 weeks, including winter and spring vacations (except the University's two-week closure for Christmas and New Year).
<b>Becket Court Keynes College</b>	31 weeks, excluding winter and spring vacations. In the winter vacation, you can leave your belongings in your room but during the spring vacation you need to vacate your room and remove all your belongings.

## Undergraduate accommodation

You have three catering options available to you on campus. You can live in self-catered, bed and bistro, or bed and flex accommodation.

### Self-catered

The self-catered option means that you have access to a shared kitchen so you can prepare your own meals.

Our student village, Park Wood, is located in a beautiful woodland setting a few minutes' walk from central campus. It has flats with en-suite bedrooms and five or six-bedroom houses with shared bathroom facilities.

On central campus, Turing College has flats with en-suite bedrooms and houses with shared bathroom facilities. Keynes offers flats with en-suite bedrooms. Tyler Court offers flats with en-suite bedrooms, while Darwin College has shared bathroom facilities.

### Bed and bistro

With bed and bistro, your breakfast and dinner are included in your fees during term-time only, taking the stress out of your first year of university. You have breakfast and dinner at our bistro Dolche Vita, in Keynes College, from Monday to Friday and at Rutherford Dining Hall at weekends and bank holidays.

This option is available for residents of the main building at Keynes College and at Becket Court, both of which have en-suite rooms with access to a small kitchenette for preparing drinks and snacks.

### Bed and flex

With this option, you have £8 per day, seven days a week, (during term-time only) to spend on food in a variety of catering outlets across campus. This gives you the freedom to try a wide range of international food from salads and stir-fries to burgers and fajitas.

This option is available at Eliot and Rutherford Colleges, which have rooms arranged in corridors with shared kitchenettes and bathroom facilities.

### Postgraduate accommodation

Accommodation at Woolf College is offered to eligible full-time postgraduate students in their first year of study. The accommodation comprises flats of six or eight single-occupancy bedrooms.

Three types of room are available at Woolf College, all for single occupancy only: studio flats with their own cooking facilities, standard en-suite rooms and large en-suite rooms. All rooms have wired and Wi-Fi internet access.

Each flat has a large, fully equipped shared kitchen and the College has its own launderette.

Woolf College has a diverse community, with more than 60 nationalities represented. The college has a lecture theatre and seminar rooms, so you live and study in a thriving community.

To qualify for a place, you should be a full-time postgraduate student on a 12-month programme of study starting in September.

Postgraduates on short-term exchange or diploma programmes, whose academic registration is for less than 12 months or whose programme doesn't begin in September, will be housed in Darwin Houses.

# ACCOMMODATION AT CANTERBURY (CONT)

## Questions and answers

### How much are the accommodation fees?

Fees vary depending on the accommodation. Please see the table on p14-15 for 2017/18 prices, which are for guidance only. Accommodation prices for 2018/19 will be available from January 2018 at [www.kent.ac.uk/accommodation](http://www.kent.ac.uk/accommodation)

### What do fees include?

Fees include high-speed wired and Wi-Fi internet connection, personal contents room insurance and gas, electricity and water charges. For details of what else is included by accommodation type, see p14-15.

### When should I apply?

To qualify for an offer of accommodation (subject to eligibility), you should apply online at [www.kent.ac.uk/accommodation](http://www.kent.ac.uk/accommodation) as soon as you accept your academic offer or by 31 July 2018 at the latest. For more details, see p12.

### How can I pay my fees?

Accommodation fees can be paid in two ways:

- in full for the entire year – this qualifies for a 2% discount if cleared funds are received by the start of term
- termly in advance (as per your accommodation agreement).

### Which accommodation is suitable for my needs?

If you have particular conditions, such as a physical disability, medical, dietary or other needs that may affect your accommodation choices, please advise us on your online application.

### Can my partner and/or children stay with me?

The University has only a few rooms suitable for couples studying postgraduate qualifications. We regret that there is no accommodation suitable for students with children.

### Is parking available on campus?

There is no parking available for students living on campus. Exceptions will be made for students who are Blue Badge holders because of a disability. Please contact the transport team for more details: [www.kent.ac.uk/transport](http://www.kent.ac.uk/transport)

### Living off campus

Most first-year undergraduate students stay in University accommodation. If, however, you decide to live off campus in your first year of study, it's a good idea to arrange a short stay in Canterbury so you can look at accommodation in advance. It is not advisable to agree to rent, or pay for, private accommodation without seeing it first.

From their second year onwards, undergraduates usually join with friends to rent houses or flats off campus.

# CANTERBURY CAMPUS INFORMATION

## KentOne card

When you first arrive at Kent, you are given a student ID/cashless card. As well as being your photo ID, this can also be topped up with funds, then used as a discounted cashless payment card to buy food and drink in Kent Hospitality outlets and the Gulbenkian café bar, as well as in Blackwell's Bookshop. It can also be used in the Kent Union shop, Essentials, on the Canterbury campus. For more details, see [www.kent.ac.uk/kentonecard](http://www.kent.ac.uk/kentonecard)

## Places to eat and drink

There is a wide variety of outlets on campus that cater for most tastes, including national cuisines and vegetarian options. You can buy food and household items at Essentials, and snacks and drinks from vending machines across campus. If you are in self-catering accommodation, you can buy groceries from any of the major supermarkets in Canterbury.

## Catering package

We offer a catering package, Flex, that is open to anyone from any year, living on or off campus, and offers the chance to save up to 40% on your annual weekday meal costs. When you receive your accommodation offer from the University, you can visit our online store at [www.kent.ac.uk/catering](http://www.kent.ac.uk/catering) and sign up to the scheme.

If you are in part-catered accommodation, check the terms of your package before signing up to Flex, as some food may already be included.



## Insurance

Fees for University accommodation include limited insurance for loss of personal possessions in respect of claims arising from fire, flood or theft, including walk-in theft. You can arrange additional cover online via the insurer's website for accidental damage or all risks on high-value items such as mobile phones and laptops.

## Car parking

Parking on campus is restricted and our green transport strategy encourages students not to bring cars on to the campus. If you live on campus, you may not bring your car to the University. The only exception is for students who are Blue Badge holders because of a disability. Students who live off campus, outside designated postcode areas of Canterbury city centre, can apply for a parking permit from the Estates Department after arriving at Kent. ## Laundry

There are self-service launderettes in all residential areas across campus, with coin and card-operated washers and driers.

## Bedding and bed linen

You need to supply your own bedding, bed linen and towels if you are in campus accommodation. You can buy these items from our online store at: [www.kent.ac.uk/accommodation](http://www.kent.ac.uk/accommodation)

## Computer connection

## Televisions


Bedrooms do not contain televisions or TV aerials (except the extra-large en-suite rooms at Keynes Flats and the extra-large rooms at Turing College). You will need to pay for a television licence if:

- you want to use a TV in your room
- you want to watch live TV programmes on your computer or on other electronic devices
- you want to watch or download any content from the BBC's iPlayer website.

# UNDERGRADUATE AND POSTGRADUATE ACCOMMODATION AT MEDWAY

**All eligible undergraduate and postgraduate students studying at our Medway campus can live at Liberty Quays – modern, self-catered, en-suite accommodation.**

Liberty Quays is part of a dynamic waterside village, Victory Pier, on the banks of the River Medway next to Gillingham Marina, and the site of our bar and bistro, Cargo. It is just a ten-minute walk from the Medway campus, with its own Tesco Express, Subway and Domino's Pizza outlets.

Typically, the flats house five to eight students, who share a fully equipped kitchen. All bedrooms have their own shower, washbasin and toilet. The accommodation has its own social facilities and launderette, and each room has access to the University computer network and the internet.

Accommodation is offered to full-time undergraduate students and postgraduate students who meet our eligibility criteria (see p13). You can stay in our accommodation during your second and third year, but will need to apply each year.

## Contract and fees

Liberty Quays is a partnership development between the University and Liberty Living.

Liberty Living will send you your accommodation offer. You will enter into a contract with, and pay fees directly to, them.

## Car parking

Parking at Liberty Quays is restricted to Disabled Parking Scheme Blue Badge holders only, for people with a permanent disability that affects their mobility.

# EUROPEAN CENTRES

## Our postgraduate centres in Athens, Brussels, Paris and Rome are in varied settings, from modern city centres to historical suburbs.

While the University does not offer accommodation at these centres, there are arrangements in place to assist you, which vary from centre to centre.

### Athens

The centre is located in the Athenian suburb of Eleusina, only 30km from the city centre.

Kent does not offer University accommodation in Athens but the local team can provide you with information and advice. Please contact the local administrator at [heritage@aueb.gr](mailto:heritage@aueb.gr)

### Brussels

Brussels School of International Studies is located close to the student district between our partner universities Vrije Universiteit Brussel and the Université Libre de Bruxelles. The School is a 15-minute drive from the centre of Brussels and is well served by public transport.

Although the University does not offer campus accommodation in Brussels, there is a wealth of affordable private rental options.

### Paris

Our Paris centre is situated at Columbia Global Center (known as Reid Hall), in the historic heart of Montparnasse.

Students studying in Paris for a term or on a year-long MA programme are responsible for securing their own private accommodation.

There are many options: you may prefer to rent a flat on your own or share with other students (organised independently or through an agency), live in student halls, or live with host families if you wish to improve your French.

### Rome

The American University of Rome's campus is in the picturesque Monteverde district, just a short bus ride from the historic centre of Rome.

On the relevant degree programmes, the first term is spent in Canterbury. If you wish to live on the Canterbury campus, you must apply for campus accommodation before 31 July 2018.

The spring term is spent in Rome. You may prefer to organise your own privately rented accommodation in Rome before you arrive.

Alternatively, The American University of Rome may be able to arrange accommodation for you for a fee.

# APPLYING FOR ACCOMMODATION AND ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

## Application deadline

Applications for accommodation must be received by 31 July 2018. You should apply for accommodation as soon as you receive formal confirmation of an offer from the University (for eligibility conditions, see facing page).

## Undergraduate applicants UCAS applicants

You should apply online for accommodation as soon as you receive formal confirmation via UCAS or UCAS Extra of a conditional or unconditional offer from the University, even if Kent is your insurance choice.

## Other full-time, short-term and exchange students (non-UCAS)

You should apply online for accommodation as soon as you receive formal confirmation of an offer from the University.

## Postgraduate applicants

You should apply for accommodation as soon as you receive formal confirmation of an offer from the University.

### Canterbury campus

Postgraduate students applying for accommodation on the Canterbury campus should complete the online application form at [www.kent.ac.uk/accommodation](http://www.kent.ac.uk/accommodation)

Accommodation at Woolf College and Tyler Court A is offered on a 52-week basis. Any postgraduate students whose academic registration is for a period shorter than 12 months (short-term exchange or diploma students) will be accommodated in Darwin Houses.

### Medway campus

Postgraduate applicants should see [www.libertyliving.co.uk](http://www.libertyliving.co.uk) for information about accommodation available to them at Liberty Quays. For more information, see p10.

## Offers of accommodation (subject to eligibility)

The University makes new student allocations once all conditions have been met and unconditional places have been confirmed.

For Canterbury accommodation, the offer of a room will be sent to you by email in late August or early September. You can then view your offer and accept it online. For Medway accommodation, the offer of a room will be sent to

you by Liberty Living and you should accept your offer and make payment directly to Liberty Living:

## Deferred entry

If you have been accepted for deferred entry in September 2019, you do not need to complete a 2018 accommodation application. You should complete a 2019 online application, available from January 2019 at: [www.kent.ac.uk/accommodation](http://www.kent.ac.uk/accommodation)

## Other information for completing the online application

### Accommodation preferences

Most corridors, flats and houses are mixed male and female accommodation. If you would prefer to live in female- or male-only accommodation, you should request this option on your online accommodation application form under 'Other Accommodation Requests'.

If you are applying for undergraduate accommodation on the Canterbury campus, you can request up to four preferences on your accommodation application, two of which can be en-suite. While we cannot guarantee to meet preferences, priority will be given to students choosing Kent as their firm choice on a first-come first-served basis according to date of accommodation application.

## Students with disabilities and specific needs

If you have particular conditions, such as a physical disability, medical, dietary or other needs that may affect your accommodation choices, please advise us on your online application.

A number of rooms in Park Wood, Rutherford, Keynes and Turing Colleges, Tyler Court and Woolf College (Canterbury) and Liberty Quays (Medway) are available for wheelchair users or students with other disabilities.

## No-smoking law

Smoking is strictly controlled under UK laws and is not permitted in any room or communal area of student accommodation. To safeguard health, smoking is not permitted within five metres of any University building.

## Eligibility for accommodation

### Undergraduate students (including foundation year)

We offer accommodation to new, full-time undergraduate students starting in September 2018 for the first year of study, provided the following criteria are met:

- you firmly accept (ie as your first choice) either a conditional or unconditional offer from this University by 31 July 2018
- the University receives your online application for accommodation by 31 July 2018.

### Postgraduate students

We offer accommodation to new, full-time postgraduate students starting in September 2018 for the first year of study, provided the following criteria are met:

- you have satisfied all the conditions of your offer by 31 July 2018
- the University receives your online application for accommodation by 31 July 2018
- a non-refundable advance payment of rent is received by 31 July 2018.

## Short-term and exchange students

We offer accommodation to short-term and exchange students starting in September 2018, provided:

- you receive acknowledgement of your provisional registration or offer by 31 July 2018
- the University receives your online application for accommodation by 31 July 2018.

Students starting in January 2019 should apply for accommodation on campus by mid-December 2018. Applications are accepted from October 2018.

We offer University accommodation to insurance, Late, Adjustment and Clearing acceptances subject to availability.
