

LIST OF STAGE 1 WILD MODULES AVAILABLE

Wild modules are modules that fall outside the subject area of your programme of study. If your programme permits wild modules to be taken then you should refer to this document only to help you select them. Students in stage 1 must choose level 4 modules with the exception of languages, which may be studied at any level provided that prerequisites are met and that you comply with [credit framework](#) rules. Please check with [SECL](#) or [CEWL](#) if you are unsure of your language level.

Although you are free to apply for any module from this Wild Modules list you should note that some modules require certain prerequisite qualifications.

Timetables will not be published until September but please note, it is your responsibility to check your timetable prior to the start of term to ensure your wild module selections DO NOT clash with your required modules. Please note that if a Wild module registration does create a timetable clash with your required modules, you will need to withdraw from the wild module and select another.
