Note: It is ultimately your responsibility to ensure that you are registered for the correct modules for your programme.

This programme is available as either a Single Honours degree, or as a Joint Honours degree with a subject in Humanities or Social Sciences. Attention is also drawn to the programmes in War Studies, and History and Archaeological Studies.

Students must study **120 Credits** at both Stages 2 and 3, giving a total of **240 Credits** over the two stages. At least 90 Credits must be at Level H to be eligible for an Honours degree. Stage 2 students should take modules at Level I; Stage 3 students should take modules at Level H.

Students may take up to 30 Credits of Wild modules per stage. Students **must** ensure they have selected 60 Credits in the Autumn term, and 60 Credits in the Spring term at each stage.

History students may be interested in the list of [Classics and Archaeological Studies](#) modules offered at Stages 2 and 3, which may be taken as part of students' Wild module choices.

Special Subjects and HI605 Independent Documentary Study in History

All Single Honours Stage 3 History Students **must** take one Special Subject module **and** HI605 Independent Documentary Study in History.

Full details of the Special Subjects available in a student's final year will be circulated to Stage 2 students during the Spring term of their second year.

HISTORY AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL STUDIES

This degree programme combines the study of archaeology with medieval or post-medieval as well as ancient history. In Stages 2 and 3, the modules allow students to further their study of how history and archaeology converge in the study of the past. Museum and site visits are incorporated as appropriate. The archaeology modules include an option studying Archaeological Fieldwork methods and techniques. Opportunities to participate in practical excavation and fieldwork linked to staff projects in Britain and abroad are frequent.

Students must study **120 Credits** at both Stages 2 and 3 giving a total of **240 Credits** over the two stages. At least 90 Credits must be at Level H to be eligible for an Honours degree. Stage 2 students should take modules at Level I; Stage 3 students should take modules at Level H. Students **must** ensure they have selected 60 Credits in the Autumn term, and 60 Credits in the Spring term at each stage.

Over Stages 2 and 3 **at least 90 Credits** must be taken in History modules and **at least 90 Credits** chosen from the tables in the [Classical and Archaeological Studies](#) section of this handbook.

Students may take up to 30 Credits of Wild modules at each stage.

The aim of this programme is to extend the opportunities available for the study of History at the University of Kent in the light of its well-established role as a University with strong interests in European connections. It is envisaged that those who have completed this degree will have attained a detailed understanding of European culture and institutions through the specialised study of European History in English and in a European language. The programme includes a year abroad at a European University.

Students must study **120 Credits** at both Stages 2 and 3 giving a total of **240 Credits** over the two stages. At least 90 Credits must be at Level H to be eligible for an Honours degree. Stage 2 students should take modules at Level I; Stage 3 students should take Level H modules. Students **must** ensure they have selected 60 Credits in the Autumn term, and 60 Credits in the Spring term at each stage.

WAR STUDIES

Note: It is ultimately your responsibility to ensure that you are registered for the correct modules for your programme.

This programme gives students the opportunity to study a range of modules that focus on war and conflict. The modules range across a wide chronological sweep and geographical zones, providing an extremely broad field of study. As well as looking at the causes and effects of war, the School of History also offers modules that examine military history and operational aspects of warfare. War Studies is only available as a Single Honours degree.

Students must study **120 Credits** at both Stages 2 and 3 giving a total of **240 Credits** over the two stages. At least 90 Credits must be at Level H to be eligible for an Honours degree. Stage 2 students should take modules at Level I; Stage 3 students should take modules at Level H. Students **must** ensure they have selected 60 Credits in the Autumn term, and 60 Credits in the Spring term at each stage.
