This free exhibition, celebrating the life and work of the bestselling Victorian author Mary Braddon, marks the launch of the International Centre for Victorian Women Writers at Canterbury Christ Church University.

The exhibition includes letters, drawings, photographs and literature from The Braddon Archive which has recently been transferred from the Braddon family to the Centre.

The Centre aims to spearhead new and innovative research in the area of Victorian Women's Writing, providing an international focus for scholars.

The Centre is led by Professor Adrienne Gavin and Dr Carolyn Oulton of the English and Language Studies Department.

Alongside the exhibition will be a free open lecture by visiting research fellow and Braddon Archive expert, Dr Gabrielle Malcolm, at 5.30pm on Monday 16 July.
