Cambridge Central Asian New Year Navroz Celebrations, University of Cambridge, 19 March 2021



Cambridge Central Asia Forum in collaboration with GCRF COMPASS and the Centre of Development Studies organised the annual Navroz (Spring Festival) celebrations on 19 March

2021. This year the programme was virtual. The Embassies of Azerbaijan, Uzbekistan and Tajikistan along with Krygyz Republic, Turkmenistan, Afghanistan and representatives from the Nursultan Nazarbayev Foundation, Kazakhstan participated in the event. The Ambassadors of the countries gave a short address, followed by a recitation of poetry and a video of a national dance, music and song was shown.



International academic conference 'The Riga Peace Treaty of 1921 in Destinies of the Peoples of Eastern and Central Europe', BSU, 18 March 2021



GCRF COMPASS BSU organised a conference on 'The Riga Peace Treaty of 1921 in Destinies of the Peoples of Eastern and Central Europe' dedicated to the 100th anniversary of conclusion of the Treaty. About 60 researchers from Belarus, Poland and Russia presented and discussed their research in three thematic panels dedicated to the Riga peace treaty and European diplomacy in 1918-1921; social, economic and political processes in Central and Eastern Europe in the late

XIX – early XX century and in 1921–1941. Programme can be found here.

UWED hosted an online lecture by Prof Asadu, Saitama University (Japan), 17 March 2021

Prof Hidekatsu Asada, Saitama University, Japan, gave a lecture for the students of the faculty of International economics and management of UWED. His talk was entitled, "Outlook for the Global Economy under the Covid-19 pandemic". A workshop for UWED students to analyze the prospects of the global economy in a pandemic situation first addressed issues such as the impact of Covid-19 on GDP, global economic pandemic-induced indicators. unemployment and rising debt. After that, aspects such as the restoration of international prices and the provision of vaccines to the population of the countries were also analyzed.

Talk by Prof Petra Wayland, George Marshall European Center for Security Center, UWED, 10 March 2021

Prof Petra Wayland was invited to give a talk on "The Arab Rebellion 10 years on" to the second-year students of the faculty of International relations in UWED. Prof Wayland briefed the students on the causes consequences of the Arab Spring, which began in 2011. She also highlighted the impact of the uprisings in the Arab world, governance, economy and international relations. The lecture aroused great interest among the students, and at the end of the lecture there was a Q&A session.

UWED hosted an online lecture by Prof Kunihiko Miyake, Adviser to Japanese Cabinet, UWED, 5 March 2021



On March 5, Prof Kunihiko Miyake, adviser to the Japanese Cabinet of Ministers gave a talk at UWED.

Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary Ambassador of Japan H.E. Yoshinori Fujiyama also visited UWED for this meeting. The event was joined by members of the Tashkent state institute of oriental studies and the Uzbek state university of world languages. The main part of the event began after the opening remarks of the rector of the university Komiljon Karimov and the state ambassador. Kunihiko Miyake's report "The situation in East Asia and its impact on Central Asia" is based on the author's many years of activity and his personal experience in geopolitics.

Conference on 'Possibilities of implementation of international experience in the development of ecotourism in Uzbekistan', UWED, 27 February 2021



UWED organized a round table on the topic 'Possibilities of implementation of international experience in the development of ecotourism in Uzbekistan'. Researchers at the State Committee for Tourism Development of the Republic of Uzbekistan, the Institute for the development of tourism, teachers professors and of the International University of Tourism "Silk Road", representatives of the State Committee on **Ecology** Environment, media workers, bloggers, professors UWED and students attended the conference. During the round table, issues of the development of ecological tourism, environmental protection and the positive impact of ecotourism on the country's economy were discussed. The event was part of a joint grant project of the Jean Monnet Center for Advanced Experience dealing with the European Studies in Tashkent.

Talk by His Excellency Masud Khalifazoda, Ambassador of the Republic of Tajikistan to the UK, Uni of Cambridge, 26 February 2021

On 26 February 2021, GCRF COMPASS Cambridge organised a talk by His Excellency Masud Khalifazoda, Ambassador of the Republic of Tajikistan to the UK. The ambassador spoke about the priorities of Tajikistan's development, the impact of Covid-19 on the country, British-Tajik relations in the aftermath of Brexit and the importance of urgently addressing global challenges.



Meeting at UWED with the Ambassador of Bangladesh to Uzbekistan



On February 25, the Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the People's Republic of Bangladesh to Uzbekistan, Mr. Mohammad Zahangir Alam met with students of the faculty of International Relations of the UWED. At the beginning of the event, students participated with presentations about the history, culture, economic performance of Bangladesh and its cooperation with Uzbekistan. HE Mr Alam shared important recommendations for students for their future activities based on his experience and noted that he was impressed with the activities of UWED. At the end of the conversation, the Ambassador of Bangladesh answered questions from the participants.

Talk on American International Relations, UWED, 19 February 2021

On February 19, a well-known US expert on Central Asia Victoria Clement, as well as Doctor of Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Honorary Associate Prof of the Mershon Center at Ohio State University, Brian M.Pollins gave online lectures about the new American concept of international relations.

At the beginning of the meeting, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Republic of Uzbekistan Javlon Vakhabov discussed the positive dynamics of the development of cooperation between Uzbekistan and the United States. He outlined the main provisions of his article "The US must remain engaged with Central Asia", recently published in Newsweek.




Talk on 'Good Governance', UWED, 18 February 2021



UWED welcomed Prof Polly Segelski who gave lectures in the second semester of the 2020-2021 academic year on the subject of "Global Governance". She was accompanied by the Public Relations Counselor of the US Embassy in Tashkent, Alexis Sullivan, as well as the Public Relations Specialist of this Embassy, S. Musakhanova. Rector K. Karimov informed the guests in detail about the structure, educational and research activities of UWED, with the prospects

for its development. During the meeting, Ms. Alexis Sullivan highly appreciated the large-scale reforms carried out by President Sh. Mirziyoyev in Uzbekistan in recent years, including in the field of education and science, and also spoke about various American educational and professional exchange programs for students and researchers, including the Fulbright program, within which P. Siegelski arrived at UWED for teaching.

COMPASS Training School at ADA University, 15-19 February 2021



15-19 February 2021 ADA University, under the auspices of GCRF COMPASS project, organised an International Training School for the early career researchers. The focus of the School was on Human Security in a Globalising World, involving international speakers such as Prof Mary Kaldor (LSE IDEAS), Dr Mary Martin (UN Business and Human Security Initiative LSE), Dr Bruno Martins (PRIO Norway), Dr Ingvild Bode (SDU Denmark), Dr Ayca Ergun (METU Turkey), Dr Farid Shafiyev, Ambassador and Chairman of the Centre of Analysis of International Relations.

Talk by Dr Taleh Ziyadov on 'Regional Development and Prospects of Cooperation in the Caucasus: Economic Connectivity', Uni of Cambridge, 10 February 2021

On 10 February 2021, the Cambridge Central Asian Forum, under the auspices of GCRF COMPASS project, has organised a talk by Dr Taleh Ziyadov, on Economic Connectivity in the Caucasus. Dr Ziyadov is Director-General of Baku International Sea Trade Port in Azerbaijan. He spoke about the history of the Silk Roads connecting Azerbaijan with ancient Eurasia, and the current challenges and opportunities presented to the country aiming to become a global hub (and a free zone) for the wider Eurasia connectivity in the future.



Conference on "International relations: history, theory, practice", BSU, 4 February 2021

Academic conference young of researchers of the Faculty of International Relations (FIR) "International History, Relations: Theory, Practice" was held on February 4, 2021 at the BSU (Minsk). The conference was organized by the BSU FIR with the support of the GCRF COMPASS. Among the co-organizers are the International Public Association for Research and Information and Educational Programs "Evolutio", the public association "Center for Foreign Policy and Security Studies", the public association for European Studies, the public association "Society of International Law". About 90 Russian young Belarusian and researchers and specialists in International Relations, Law and Tourism, World Economy, Customs, Diplomatic and Consular Services and Intercultural Communication had a good possibility to discuss the achievements and challenges of the modernity.

Discussions were organized in eight sections: (1) Actual aspects of foreign policy, diplomatic and consular practice in modern international relations; (2) International law: theory and practice of application in modern conditions; (3) Theoretical and practical problems of international private and integration law; (4) Modern trends in the development of the world economy and international economic relations; (5) Topical issues of customs; (6) Management of mass events; (7) Modern directions of research in the intercultural paradigm of communication; (8) Linguistic and regional studies.



Masterclass by Suma Chakrabarti, Former head of EBRD, UWED, 2 February 2021



On February 2 2021, UWED took part in the first master class run by the Adviser to the President of the Republic Uzbekistan on economic development, effective management and international cooperation, Suma Chakrabarti. The topic of the master class was 'Leadership Skills'. Suma Chakrabarti laid out 10 lessons for leaders based on his 4 leadership skills and experiences. At the end of the lecture, the audience asked interesting questions, and the conversation ended meaningfully. Suma Chakrabarti is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts, Honorary Doctorate of the Universities of Sussex and East Anglia, and the Bucharest Academy of Economic Research. From 2002 to 2007, he was Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of International Development, and then until 2012, he held a similar position in the Ministry of Justice. During this period, one of his main achievements was recognized as the development and implementation of a new model of the ministry's activities. This saved over £ 1 billion. From 2012 to 2020, Chakrabarti served as President of the European Reconstruction Bank for Development.

Distinguished Foreign Guest Lecture, BSU, 26 January 2021



On January 26, 2021 GCRF COMPASS Co-I Dr S. Saxena delivered the Distinguished Foreign Guest Lecture in the Framework of the 'Belarusian State University - Winter School 2021'. Dr Saxena spoke 'Greening on Development: Α Scientific Understanding of Supply and Value Chain' and answered a number of questions from the audience that included BSU students from various disciplines.




Civil Societies Conversations Webinar Series with Eurasian Civil Society Leaders, University of Cambridge, January-December 2021

Virtual Workshop 'Shifting geopolitics of the South caucasus after the Nagorno-Karabakh War', ADA University, 22-23 December 2020



On 22 December 2020 ADA University has organised a virtual workshop 'Shifting geopolitics of the South caucasus after the Nagorno-Karabakh War'. In late September 2020, three Nagorno-Karabakh decades long conflict went into the most violent phase since 1994. Azerbaijan and Armenia were able to reach a new cease-fire agreement through unilateral mediation of Russia. How long will the peace agreement last, and what are the consequences of the new geopolitics? What is the role for the EU and other international players? Lecture by Prof Weyland, George C. Marshall European Center for Security Studies, UWED, 4 December 2020



UWED organised a lecture series with Prof Weyland on international relations. The webinar was organized by the Department of Applied analysis of international problems of the faculty of International relations of University of World Economy and Diplomacy. The webinar was attended by more than 50 students of the faculty of international relations and teachers. Prof Wayland spoke in detail about modern theories of international relations and relationship with modern trends in politics and international relations, the ongoing transformation processes in international relations. GCRF COMPASS Work in Progress Seminar, Uni of Kent, 3 December 2020


On 3 December 2020 the University of Kent held the final Work-in-Progress Seminar (WiPS) of the Autumn term.

On 11 March 2021, COMPASS Advisory Board Member, Prof Magnus Marsden from the University of Sussex gave an insightful lecture on 'Inter-Asia through Inland Eves: Afghan Trading Networks across Land and Sea'. His talk demonstrated the significance of long-distance networks formed by traders from Afghanistan and Central Asia to the forging of presentday transregional connections within Asia. He focused on two specific corridors of connectivity authored by these traders: a 'Eurasian corridor' connecting East Asia to post-Soviet Eurasia and extending into Western Europe and a 'West Asian corridor' involving traders originally from Central Asia linking East Asia to Turkey and the Arabian Peninsula, thus exposing the ancient connectivity of the region with the world. Magnus Marsden is Professor of Social Anthropology and Director of the Asia Centre at the University of Sussex. He has conducted fieldwork in Muslim Asia, especially Pakistan and Afghanistan for over twenty years. His publications include Living Islam (Cambridge, 2005), Fragments of the Afghan Frontier (Hurst/Oxford, 2012), Trading Worlds (Hurst/Oxford, 2016), and Beyond the Silk Road (Cambridge, 2021).

Panel Discussion: Interacting with China in a Complex World, 17 November 2020



5th Annual Tartu Conference on Russian and East European Studies, Post-Socialist (dis)Orders, Estonia 6-8 June 2021

The Tartu Conference is a venue for academic discussion of the fundamental cultural, social, economic and political trends affecting all aspects of people's life in Russia and Eastern Europe. Inaugurated in June 2016 as the flagship event of the Horizon 2020 UPTAKE consortium, this forum brings together scholars from across multiple disciplines, from the region and beyond. The 2021 Tartu Conference is organized by the UT's Centre for Eurasian and Studies (CEURUS) cooperation with the PONARS Eurasia research network. GCRF COMPASS consortium members submitted two panels, both of which were accepted. The panels accepted are, Panel 1: The Eurasian Post Socialist Order and Panel and Panel 2: The relevance of 'local' in order formation: resilience as selfgovernance in Central Eurasia. ADA University GCRF COMPASS Signature Conference, Baku, 16-17 June 2021

This international signature conference organised by the ADA University under the aegis of the GCRF COMPASS project brings together a range of topinternational academics, level practitioners, policymakers businesses to explore and discuss existing regional powers' strategic priorities, instruments and practices in regional connectivity for mutual benefit. A particular focus will be on the role of Azerbaijan as a natural geo-hub for connectivity initiatives, and a testfor their success ground compatibility.

The diverse and thought-provoking conference programme will make this ADA University's Signature Conference a platform for identifying major trends in cooperation and connectivity, and discussing their implications for the domestic, regional international development opportunities and challenges. We will explore connectivity as a global megatrend and extrapolate what it means for the Europe-Asia relationship and particularly how it affects Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia, as a geo-connectivity platform targeted by major international stakeholders. In connectivity will particular, examined through various aspects including geopolitics, social welfare and economics to business opportunities (stat-ups) and finance.

Eurasian Insights Conference in Ghent: Past, current and upcoming dynamics in the Central Asian region, and their (possible) impacts for Europe, 22-24 September 2021

The conference brings together insights into the wider Central Asian region. The purposes of the event are threefold: Firstly, to bring together scholars, students, interested members of the public and policymakers working on or interested in the Central Asian region to interact and, as such, strengthen a network of Central Asia-related research and -education in Europe. Secondly, to show, by examining its identities and historical roots, societal political and dynamics, external interactions. and economy and environment, that the Central Asian region is not merely a passive object in abstract geopolitics, but that it also has histories, societies, identities and aspirations of its own. Thirdly, examine what (potential) effects and impacts of developments in Central Asia, a region situated right beyond Europe's eastern rim, have on the EU and Europe in general (and vice-versa). **GCRF** COMPASS Consortium panel was accepted. Following the successful first year of implementation of Creating Enterprise: Business Start-Up Journey -Azerbaijan/UK project in 2019/2020, an international team led by University of Kent (UK) and ADA University and Azerbaijan State University of Culture and Arts (Azerbaijan) won the right to continue work on the project for the second consecutive year. As a result of this collaboration the project and the resulting platform will seek to improve the low rate of entrepreneurial education among Azerbaijani students studying in creative fields. The first year of the project has been finalized in May 2020, with finalization of the 8 weeks long Creating Enterprise: The Business Start-Up Journey Entrepreneurship Skills Course organized by ADA University in

partnership with University of Kent Business School (UK).

Prof Elena Korosteleva interviewed by Jon Snow, ITN Channel 4, 8 February 2021



On 8 February 2021, Prof Elena Korosteleva was interviewed by Jon Snow on a 6pm ITN Channel 4 News to speak about the continued protests in Belarus. Six months on since the fraudulent presidential election of 9 August 2020, the protests have now acquired a new format - more localised, neighbourhood based (supol'nast'), mobilising local people, getting to know the neighbours, and coming together, to make change sustainable and future more tangible, through resiliencebuilding. Prof Korosteleva reflected this in her interview, drawing on her work with COMPASS PDRA Dr Petrova about the rise of 'peoplehood' in Belarus and wider Eurasia, as part of the GCRF COMPASS project.
