Theresa A. Gannon is a Professor of Forensic Psychology in the School of Psychology at the University of Kent. She obtained a First Class Honours Degree in Psychology from the University of Birmingham, in 1998, a Doctorate in Psychology from the University of Sussex in 2003, and Forensic Psychologist Practitioner Status in 2007.

Theresa has written over 100 peer reviewed journal articles and book chapters in the areas of sexual, violent offending, and firesetting. She has also edited numerous books in forensic psychology and assesses and treats offenders who have sexually offended or set fires on a weekly basis. Theresa is Editor of the *Journal Psychology Crime and Law*, and Associate Editor of the *Journal of Sexual Aggression*.

Theresa now leads the University of Kent's Centre of Research and Education in Forensic Psychology (CORE-FP) in the School of Psychology.
