Europe and the World

16-29 June 2019

Explore the main challenges facing the European Union through study visits and interactive seminars and debate with policy makers from institutions such as NATO and the European Parliament.

Paris

14-26 July 2019

Explore Paris through tailored seminars by expert academics on the theme of Revolutions in art, history and literature. Visit major sites such as the Louvre, Picasso Museum and Versailles.

7-14 July 2019

Study people, places, practices and things in the urban setting of the city of Paris.

Law in a Digitised Global Economy

16 June – 7 July 2019

Examine the evolving role of law in the increasingly digitised global economy on a multidisciplinary course. Students have an opportunity to explore digital innovations such as artificial intelligence (AI), blockchain, and cryptocurrencies and the

challenges they pose for human rights law and regulatory frameworks. Emergent consumer protection legal frameworks and sovereignty and national legal systems will also be explored.

Molecular Biology and IVF

16-30 June 2019

Gain cutting-edge research skills in this ever-growing and increasingly important scientific discipline through hands-on generation of IVF embryos, chromosome analysis and fluorescence in-sit hybridisation.

Introduction to Wine Science

6 May – 21 June 2019

Develop an understanding of basic viticultural, oenological and sensory principles and practices. Topics covered include: grape varieties; the annual growth cycle of the grapevine; the factors that influence crop yield; berry development and composition; wine classification; the taste and olfactory system; and taste and aroma interactions.

International Relations: Making Sense of the World Today

7-28 July 2019

Develop your understanding of global issues and gain conceptual tools to analyse and understand contemporary issues in global politics on this multidisciplinary course. Experience a variety of

topics including Political theory, Conflict and Peace, Globalisation, the United Nations, Terrorism, Human Rights and Migration, while reflecting on historical events and current affairs.

Quantitative Methods

16-30 June 2019

Undergraduate level. Study the core elements of statistical analysis covering a range of quantitative skill areas including regression, contingency tables and continuous data in a problem-based learning environment.

Child Protection

16-30 June 2019

Explore the application of child protection via the Centre for Child Protection's innovative interactive simulations, inspired by a wide range of perspectives including the family perspective, the view of the child and health & social care professionals. In this introductory module, the emphasis will be on looking at how to protect children in families and on social media.

Global Business in a Dynamic Environment

30 June – 14 July 2019

Explore the core theories and activities involved in International Business and the complexity of decision making on a global scale.
